

Mad Editor Assignment, Instructions

1. If you are starting this assignment for the **first time**, go back to Mr. Mistishen's Shared Drive, 7th Grade, Assignments, Mad Editor folder and open the file called, **Mad Editor File**.

(If you have already started, and are continuing to work on this assignment, click the office button and open the **Mad Editor file** in your directory that you already started.)

2. Go to the Office Button, click Save As, and immediately save the **Mad Editor file** to your directory.
3. Type your name and section at the top of the **Mad Editor File**.
4. Using the information in the tables below, select and change the font, size, and/or style to all necessary letters, words, and sentences. Use the handout to assure you are making the proper changes. The changes you make on the **Mad Editor File** should look exactly like the handout.
5. When done, your **Mad Editor File** should look exactly the same as the handout.

In 1655, Peter Stuyvesant, the governor of New Netherland, led an expedition against the Swedes and imposed Dutch rule. Dutch authority terminated when, in 1664, a British force seized New Netherland (present day New York).
